Insulating Right - Behind Tubs

Insulating bathtubs and showers that are located next to an exterior wall can be very simple to do. They can also be very poorly insulated areas and end up always subject to noticeable temperature variations.

The easiest way to take care of the behind the tubs area is to call your insulators before the tub is installed. That way, you know the wall cavity is already taken care of.

If no insulation is in place before the tub installation, normal batts will rarely work as well. It can be difficult



to access the cavity, particularly in the middle and behind the tub, while still ensuring that continuous thermal protection.

Using the Blow-in-Blanket System will fill the area behind a tub or shower extremely well, while providing superior R-values and more thorough coverage. All of this helps make sure the future bather doesn't have to put up with a cooler than necessary bath.
